- While the majority of BC's students come from communities throughout the greater Puget Sound region, many students come to BC from all over the world.
 - ✓ 1,761 *International* students came from more than 70 countries.
 - ✓ 2,545 *Running Start* students came from nearly 30 school districts.
- 81% of *all* enrollments are in courses leading to a degree or certificate.
- 19% of *all* enrollments are in continuing education, basic skills, and English as a Second Language courses.
- BC Disability Resource Center serves more than 1,100 students with disabilities a year.
